James Horsford, Manger of Pennine Lancashire Community Farm said *"I'm extremely excited and honoured to have the work undertaken by Pennine Lancashire Community Farm over the last 15 years to be recognised on an international basis by such a large ethically conscious company like Lush."*

The Prize hopes to increase access to resources, information and skills "to build alternatives to the dominant culture of degeneration. We need to redesign economies and cultures, to make a fundamental shift to a regenerative culture."

Shortlisted projects come from: Brazil, Ireland, Scotland, Nicaragua, Palestine, India, Mexico, Kenya, England, Hungary, Philippines, France, Honduras and Haiti. The winners will be announced in May.
